Supermarket ideas

Sometimes shopping with your child can be hard work. They sit in a restraining trolley and are expected to sit there patiently while faced by wonderful aisles of packaging, boxes, new faces, lights etc. A delight to any toddler. Naturally they want to be involved. Here's a way of managing their natural curiosity and making these trips fun for both of you.

- ◆ Before you next go shopping, cut the labels off tins, cans and cartons you want to buy. Stick a few of these onto stiff card, (cereal boxes are good), no more than 5 to avoid confusion. For older children write a number next to these and encourage your child to match the item and count the quantity.
- ◆ Another time ask your child to look for things in the store and again put pictures of them on some card e.g. newspapers, bananas, bread counter etc.
- ◆ Give your child lots of praise and maybe even a sticker.
