We have been getting some lovely feedback on the quality of the food provided at Horn End ,so I thought you may appreciate me sharing some of our recipes with you!!

Hummus

You need: 1Red pepper, 1 small Onion, Chickpeas (in a tin or frozen), Garlic 2 gloves olive oil, lemon juice and a food processor

Method:Chargrill red pepper and onion in the oven for 10 to 15 minutes. Rinse chickpeas and place in food processor, add red peppers, onion with garlic and a little olive oil and lemon in to the food processor. Whizz down adding a little more olive oil if needed.

You can add extra lemon juice, garlic if needed.

This is delicious with wholemeal pitta bread
